## You brought two triumphant reunion seasons to life at Blossom and Severance

In 2021, our community **reunited for the first time** since the height of the pandemic—at Blossom in the summer and at Severance in the fall.

At Blossom, we shared Brahms, Broadway favorites, Beatles sing-alongs, and more. Plus, we enjoyed the first-ever **Blossom Summer Soirée,** where attendees gave more than \$100,000 in essential funds for Blossom Music Festival.

In fall 2021, the Orchestra returned to Severance for a reunion Classical Season. We were treated to a record number of new works, brilliant guest artists, and **the return of opera** with performances of Verdi's *Otello*.

Thanks to your steady support, our community experienced the joy of live music once again.

# You shared the joy of classical music with young people across our community

In 2021-22, your generous support brought in-person music education back to Severance!

Family Concerts returned last spring, featuring the Magic Circle Mime Co. and the music of Black composer and Mozart contemporary Joseph Bologne.

Education Concerts returned to the hall, and Cleveland Orchestra Youth Orchestra (COYO) members were reunited for in-person rehearsals and performances.

And during the 2021-22 school year, the Orchestra's Mindful Music Moments program, in which students enjoy classical music and mindfulness prompts through their morning announcements, was offered **FREE to all Northeast Ohio schools**.

# You helped expand the Orchestra's digital programs so people everywhere can enjoy the music

2021-22 marked a period of expansion for the Orchestra's digital programs. **Season Two of** *In Focus* premiered on the Adella streaming app and Adella.live, with six new episodes for music-lovers at home and across the globe. In addition, the **Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration Concert** in June 2022 was livestreamed for free on Adella and various other platforms.

Thanks to a transformational gift from the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Foundation, production and technology for *In Focus* grew in a tremendous way. With improved video recording equipment and new production partnerships, these episodes feature a meaningful and well-crafted exploration of the artistic process of the Orchestra and its featured guests.

And because of your giving spirit, the Orchestra released **three new recordings**, with music by Richard Strauss, George Walker, Schnittke, and Prokofiev. *Thank you*.
